
CULTURE COLLAGE

Your culture collage will be a collection of photographs, newspaper and magazine images, internet graphics, mementos and/or souvenirs that you will use to represent the many aspects of culture. You will represent the culture of your ethnic nationality. Your collage should be artistically displayed so your viewer, in this case myself and your classmates, can gain a greater understanding of your culture and important facts and ideas relating to your cultural identity. Be creative and unique in your interpretations but you must be able to explain your choices to the class. You will have class time to work on the collage, but it will require some outside of class work. Your collage must include at least one picture from ten of the following thirteen categories. More than one picture is ok, but at least one from ten of the categories.

- 1. Topography (type in your country name and "countryside"
- 2. Language (what does the language look like)
- 3. Clothing (traditional as well as clothing for customs)
- 4. Music/Dance (famous artists, and or styles of dance and music)
- 5. Currency (what does the money look like)
- 6. Food (include street food as well as customary dishes)
- 7. Ceremonies (B-Day, Wedding, Funerals, etc)
- 8. Traditions (4th of July, Thanksgiving, customs, etc)
- 9. Architecture (shape of buildings or famous buildings)
- 10. Sports (athletes and teams, sports played)
- 11. Rights of Passage (from adolescence to adult)
- 12. Government/Politics (President, Prime Minister, King, etc)
- 13. Art (famous artists or types of art)

You must also include your - Country Coat of Arms



<u>Dimensions: You will use Google Slides to make the collage, set the dimensions to 20 wide by 30 tall</u>

Your collage must also include the name of the country, the Flag of the country and a map of the country. These should be put at the top of the collage and be 6 inches tall. Such as this:



Fits a country title at 250 pixels tall

Each student will be expected to display and tell the class about their Culture. In the process of making the collage, each student should try to discover aspects of their native culture that they may not have already known. In some ways, this project serves as a history lesson about their heritage.

<u>Extra Credit Opportunities</u>: Students who wish to share an authentic food item (enough for 5 people, not the whole class) or an authentic outfit (ceremonial or traditional) or an authentic artifact (bagpipes) need to see me to arrange how this will be presented.

The collage project is worth 32 points - When submitting it to be printed you MUST download as a JPEG from slides and upload to the classroom folder as a JPEG
